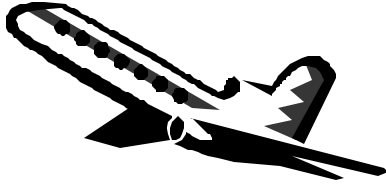
Wedgefield Garden Club

12 Practical Tips For Planning A Trip



Leave early for the airport – two hours ahead for domestic flights; three hours for international.

Carry a paper ticket, if possible. It will hasten your security check and it's more easily endorsed by another airline if your flight is delayed or canceled.

Don't forget identification. There's close scrutiny now, so it pays to carry more than one.

Be smart about packing. Security procedures are resulting in the confiscation of many objects, so plan accordingly. Remember that any gift-wrapped or unopened packages may be opened.

Pack fewer items. It will get you through Security quicker, so pack only what you need.

Don't dawdle at the airport. Be aware that curbside check-in is no longer available at certain airports, idling vehicles may be towed without notice, and new restrictions will make parking even harder.

Limit your send-offs. Remember, unticketed individuals are no longer allowed through security.

Be polite. Airport security will not tolerate verbal abuse. Harsh words or joking could lead to an arrest.

Know whom to call. Carry contact information for the airline and/or travel agent. It could be quicker to rebook by phone, if necessary, than to wait in a long line.

Know your rights. Airlines have specific responsibilities to assist you when your flight is delayed, canceled or diverted.

Be mindful of your surroundings at all times and report any suspicious behavior or packages to law enforcement.

Be patient. There will be longer lines.

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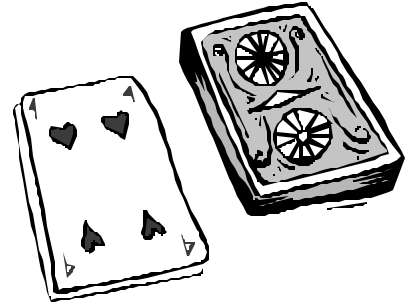

Recipe Of The Month

Roasted Pork and Autumn Vegetables

Ingredients

2 fennel bulbs (about 1 1/2lb.)
 2 small onions
 1 tablespoon olive oil, divided
 4 cups (1-inch) cubed peeled rutabaga
 16 baby carrots (about 3/4 lb.)
 1 2 1/2 lb. boneless pork loin roast
 Cooking spray
 2 tbl. spoon. Chopped fresh sage
 3/4 teaspoon kosher salt
 3/4 teaspoon ground pepper
 3/4 cup fat-free chicken broth
 2 teaspoons Dijon mustard
 1/2 cup dry white wine

1. Preheat oven to 400
2. Trim stalks from fennel, discard. Cut each fennel bulb into 8 wedges. Peel onions, cut each onion into 8 wedges.
3. Heat 1 1/2 teaspoons of oil in a large non stick skillet over medium high heat. Add fennel and onion, sauté 8 minutes or until lightly brown, stirring frequently. Remove from pan. Add remaining oil, rutabaga, and carrots to pan; sauté 5 minutes or until lightly browned, stirring frequently.
4. Place pork on a rack coated with cooking spray; place a rack in a shallow roasting pan. Sprinkle pork with sage, 1/2 salt, and 1/2 teaspoon pepper. Arrange vegetables around pork, sprinkle with 1/4 teaspoon salt and 1/4 teaspoon pepper.



5. Bake at 400 for 50 minutes or until thermometer registers 160 (slightly pink) . Remove pork and vegetables from pan ; cover lightly with foil. Place pan over medium heat; stir in broth, wine, and mustard, scraping pan to loosen browned bits. Bring to a boil, reduce heat, and simmer 4 minutes, stirring occasionally. Serve with pork and vegetables
