Home losses can be prevented by simple maintenance. Act now to make your house and yard more fire resistant. Your Wedgefield Firewise Team, in partnership with the Orange County Solid Waste Division, has arranged for a special day of yard debris pick-up. Take advantage of the next few weeks to reduce the wildfire fuels near your home. Remove pine straw and leaves from roof and gutters. Trim bushes and shrubs near house. Prune tree branches up to 10 feet from the ground. Cut into 3 foot lengths and leave it curbside prior to Saturday May 3, 2003. Loose material should be placed in bags or trash cans weighing less than 60 pounds each. Free pick-up [ vegetative material only.




## **News from The Estates**

What should one do when approaching a horse while operating a motorized vehicle. If you are driving on the road or traveling on a trail and approach a horse, please slow down. Many times horses do not hear approaching cars until they pass them and they become startled. The approach of an ATV in the woods can also startled a horse and cause a serious accident. If you are operating a motorized vehicle and come upon a horse, slow down, use caution; and if you see that rider is having difficulty controlling their horse, stop. Once the rider has> regained control of their mount, they should let you know when it's safe to proceed. With the large amount of rain we received early on this year, the mosquito population is expected to be extremely high this summer. Always remember to vaccinate your horses, keep your Coggins test up-to-date, and fly spray them regularly. There have already been cases of the West Nile Virus in Marion County and prevention is the best medicine. If you are uncertain what vaccinations you need, it is suggested that you contact your veterinarian for further information.

## Ranger Drainage Update

They're coming! Soon we will have the afternoon thundershowers that mark the rainy season here in Florida. Even though we have not really dried out in the "dry" season, the rains will come and bring with them several problems.

One of the most aggravating problems is the "wet newspaper, I can't get the mail" situation. This all too common problem is a combination of "dipped" driveways with a poorly functioning swale. When this happens, rainwater collects in the driveway and does not flow out into the swale, or the swale backs up and keeps water in the driveway.

What can the homeowner do? The best thing is to create some positive drainage in your roadside swale. This can sometimes be accomplished by cutting a "V" ditch in the bottom of the swale. Remove any built up sand or silt and remove about 2" of grass in the bottom of the swale. This will allow the water to flow away from the driveway. You should also be careful to sweep the driveway to remove any algae build-up. If left alone, the algae will become very slippery and create a real hazard. If your driveway is not "dipped", you may have standing water in the roadside swale which is caused by blockages of the small culvert pipes under the driveway. If you spend some extra effort to keep these pipes open, your problem should be solved.






# Golf Ball Drop Saturday May 3, 2003


